Notice: The entire works cited page is double spaced with no extra spacing between entries. The sources are listed in alphabetical order starting with the first word (except a, an, or the) of each source. There is no extra spacing before or after the words Works Cited, and the page is numbered consecutively as are the other pages of the paper using a header with the last name and page number. Each source is listed with a hanging indent format, which means that the first line of each entry starts at the left margin, but any subsequent lines are indented one tab, which is ½" or five spaces. Titles are shown in italics, not underlined. Citations listed are not numbered. Encyclopedias including Wikipedia are not college sources. Internal citations (not footnotes) within the student's paper after paraphrases or direct quotes from these sources would look like this:

("Blueprint") If there is no page listed because it comes from the web, don't put a page.

(Clinton A2) Even if it comes from the web, if there is a page number listed, put it in the citation.

(Gowdy 28) You don't use a comma between the name and page and don't use p. for page.
